A BIG Night for a GRAND Celebration: The Sesquicentennial Gala!

On Thursday, January 30th, over 225 souls united at Tribeca Rooftop in lower Manhattan for a dazzling celebration of Maritime College's 150th anniversary. The Sesquicentennial Gala, hosted by the MCAA, featured inspiration from College President Admiral John Okon '91, maritime expert and marine historian Dr Salvatore Mercogliano '89, and keynote speaker Rear Admiral Philip Sobeck, Commander, Military Sealift Command (MSC).

Admiral Okon discussed campus developments since he and his wife, Valerie Okon '92, returned to campus last July with a focus on addressing the headwinds impacting Maritime College today. Prof. Mercogliano touched on points of American maritime history and the parts played by Maritime College and its alumni. Admiral Sobeck, global commander of nearly 140 MSC ships, commemorated a century and a half of "can-do, get-it-done" leadership among Maritime College grads, proclaiming such leadership necessary today more than ever across the world's contested oceans. All present agreed it to be a night appropriately honoring our alma mater and her place in maritime history.

Congratulations, Newly Licensed Mariners!

January 13th-17th was a busy week for 132 cadets who sat for their U.S. Coast Guard license exams. Of 91 Deck candidates, 64 new Third Mate licenses were issued, for a pass rate of 70% after retakes. Among 41 Engine cadets, 32 Third Assistant Engineer licenses were granted, a

78% pass rate. RADM John Okon cited the new licensees in his speech at the Sesquicentennial Gala Celebration. As with all graduates, we look forward to welcoming these young mariners into the Association, and to helping them find their first job, and their second job, ... and any position they seek in their futures.

Maritime Admissions on a Roll in '25!

College President RADM John Okon '91 is pleased to share that applications, admissions, and deposits for Maritime College continue to outpace last year's numbers. Following last November's update, enrollment remains on an upward trajectory.
