President of his Alma Mater: RADM Okon '91 Takes the Helm!

On Tuesday, June 4th, nine months following RADM Alfultis' retirement announcement, SUNY Board of Trustees and Chancellor John B. King Jr. announced the appointment of RADM John Okon '91 (USN Ret.) as the twelfth SUNY Maritime College President. Adopting his new role Monday, July 1st, Okon is the first Maritime graduate to serve as College President since the 1982-95 tenure of RADM Floyd "Hoss" Miller (USN Ret., dec'd 2017) the third Maritime graduate since the College's union with SUNY, and the tenth through the 150-year history of Maritime and its precedents.

Hailing from Camillus, NY, Okon did not at first envision a maritime or naval career. But pursuing oceanography and meteorology study at Maritime, he became enthralled with the ocean. Through Naval service after graduation, "I found a community that blended the things I'm most passionate about – meteorology, oceanography, and going to sea – along with a community of strong, highly competent, character-based leaders," he related in a feature article in the Fall 2022 issue of The Fort Schuyler magazine. Thus followed his 33 years' naval service that saw him earning Master's degrees at Naval Postgraduate School and Naval War College, with multiple leadership roles culminating as Vice Commander, U.S Fleet Cyber Command, Tenth Fleet, U.S. Navy Space, Joint Force Headquarters, USN, before his appointment as President of Maritime College.
